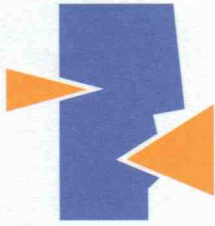
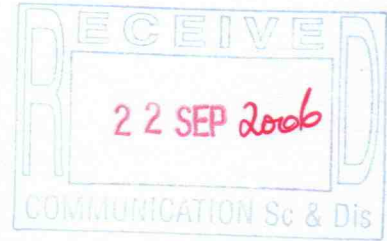

Re: Accreditation of the Master of Speech Language Pathology (pass and honours) program

Thank you for submitting Accreditation documents for the Master of Speech Language Pathology (pass and honours) program at The University of Sydney to the Speech Pathology Australia.

On the basis of the documentation provided and the site visit conducted, the Speech Pathology Australia recognises that graduates from the above mentioned program are eligible for Practising Membership.

As recommended by the Accrediting Panel, Speech Pathology Australia suggests that five years be allowed to elapse prior to a review of the current agreement, provided that no major changes occur in the curriculum. This contract is open to renegotiation by either party during this five year period.

In order to maintain your accreditation you will be asked at the conclusion of each academic year to provide a statement to Speech Pathology Australia detailing any planned changes to the curriculum, it is important that you respond to this letter and complete the declaration where no changes are planned, that will impact on CBOS (2001) assessment requirements. Upon review of this document Speech Pathology Australia will issue a letter of confirmation of the agreement for the following year.

Thank you for your cooperation in the accreditation process and for the significant amount of work you and your staff have undertaken to meet the requirements of the Association.
